NO BOOZE NEWS

As We Understand Him

I came into A.A. Bankrupt in every department. When I started to work the steps, my first big challenge was to find a power greater than myself that could solve my problems. What an order for a guy who they describe in step two in the 12x12 as the one who had tried religion and found it wanting. I could see the examples of people around me that seemed to have it figured out and I became a nuisance trying to corner them to get them to explain to Me how they do it and they had as much trouble explaining it as I did. One day I confronted my friend, Jim, and asked him to let me in on the secret. Frustrated, He asked, "Do you want to drink right now"? My answer was "NO". He then asked me, "Did you want to drink a year ago"? And my answer was "YES". Next he asked me "what made the difference'? My answer was that I was influenced by the A.A. program. His next question was, "Do you have any Problem calling that God? WOW! What a concept.

I have never wanted a drink since I entered the program and the only answer I could come up with was the influence of A.A in my life. For a guy who couldn't conceive of a day without alcohol, to a guy that has never wanted a drink since, was all I needed to know about God. I wish I could tell you who or what God is but I can't. I can, however tell you what God does for me but I'll get to that later.

The 2nd appendage in the big book, Spiritual Experience, implies that there are as many examples of spiritual experiences as there people who have had them, and they come in different forms. They can be of the burning bush variety or a psychic change sufficient to bring about recovery from alcoholism. Or, as I like to believe, my spiritual experience came in the form of a "change of perception". When it occurred to me that all of my thinking was flawed and that I was finally in an environment where I could, with the help of the group, start to follow simple unselfish guidelines that would restore my self esteem and put me at peace with myself and others, I started this wonderful journey and I've never had it so good. These universal truths are common in all philosophies and I must seek them out if I want to heal.

I pray to God every day, even though I don't know who or what God is. My mind is not sophisticated enough to understand God and I'm not sure that God hears my prayers, but I HEAR MY PRAYERS and that puts me in the best possible attitude I can have about the issue I pray for. My prayers are always the same. I pray for knowledge of his will for me and strength to carry it out. I.e. God, Please show me what to do and give me the strength to do it, I don't do to well on my own. I often knew what to do, but wasn't always strong enough to do what was right. Today I'm stronger.

Who or what is God? I'm not sure anyone can define God anymore than they can answer a few simple questions, such as: 1) where does space end and what is beyond that? 2) When does time end and what comes after that? My simple mind may never know the answers to these questions but I do know what God does. When I ask for guidance, I become a better receiver and I hear the answers that used to pass right over my head when I Thought I had all the answers. Thank God for an open mind. Rick R.

Self-Inflicted



I am then able to open the door on the past, just for a moment and compare it to today. Then I am able to see the true blessings that I have today.... My experience is that I cannot put a price tag on the peace of mind that I have today that comes from being a grateful recovering member of Alcoholics Anonymous.



Central Office Manager's Report January 19, 2018

March was another active month at the office. We received 515 requests for information and assistance last month. Of those 138 calls were for meeting info and 153 were office visitors. Google reported 11,950 views with 311 going to our website, 82 getting directions to the office and 44 calling. And our website reports 44,321 visits in the last 30 days.

We have upgraded the credit card terminal at the office. The new equipment supports EMV/chip reader and accepts credit, PIN debit

and gift cards. The new terminal cost \$200 but our service provider was offering a \$200 Costco gift card as incentive to upgrade. So we are now up to date with the latest security for electronic transactions at no cost.

The ICOAA seminar will be held in Mesa 9/25/2019 to 9/29/2019. It may sound far into the future but we do need to start forming a committee for this event. We will need people to coordinate a day trip on Thursday the 26th, staff a registration and information table and a hospitality room. Please contact me if you would like to help with this event.

If you're Group or service committee is planning an event, please remember to send a flier to the office. We try hard to have complete event information available in the office and on our website for our local members.

Service opportunities are available on all EVI committees and the 12th step list. Please take some Gratitude with Service forms back to your group and encourage them to volunteer. The life you save may be your own.

She made a deal with her Higher Power, and her sobriety finally clicked.

I grew up in an alcoholic family. Life was unpredictable and, at times, volatile. I learned at a very young age that if I acted a certain way, I wouldn't get into trouble. It was a difficult combination to figure out. Sometimes my father would be jovial, and I could let down my guard. But most of the time, I had to figure out how to be invisible.

I used the same strategy throughout school. I tried to get the right combination of doing as little homework as possible while still getting good grades. I also tried to figure out the right combination for fitting in so-cially. That's when alcohol came into my life.

One night, I snuck some vodka out of my parents' liquor cabinet. It was the first time I ever drank, and I had a blackout. I woke up the next morning in my bed with vomit all over me. I had thrown up on myself while sitting in my father's favorite chair. If I had been lying down, I could have drowned. Obviously that was the wrong combination.

For the next twenty-three years, I attempted to get the right combination of alcohol into my system, so I could feel comfortable in my own skin. A few times I was able to find it, but not often. I used to pride my-self in saying that I'd had only one blackout. Now, I realize that I'd had hundreds of "pass outs."

I had been institutionalized two times in four years. At the last treatment center, I was told I was an alcoholic. But once again, I thought I had the right combination: I was educated and well-informed about the disease and knew I would never become one, for I knew what to do when it got bad--again.

When I finally decided I had had enough, I came into the rooms of Alcoholics Anonymous. I thought I knew what I had to do to stay sober. Again, I thought I had the right combination. I was miserable. Sure, I went to meetings once or twice a week, and I had a sponsor whom I called when I had time. And I did pray, when I was in a real jam. I don't know how I stayed sober the first two years.

I was ready to commit suicide. I didn't know what to do. So I asked my Higher Power for help. I bought a meeting book and discovered there was a meeting five minutes away that met daily. I made a deal with my Higher Power and committed myself to go to a meeting every day. It helped; it really did. I started praying every day. Then I started reading the Big Book and the "Twelve and Twelve." I started to call my sponsor even when there was no crisis in my life. I worked the Steps. I became involved in the fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous. I started sponsoring people. So far, the combination of not drinking, going to meetings, asking for help, praying and meditating, doing service, working with others, and reading AA materials (including the Grapevine), has worked for me. I look back now with gratitude for the people who were there for me in my best and worst times. I think I have a great combination that works for me.
