## My Resentment Story

**2019** 

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I was 5 months sober - stark raving sober! When I hit my bottom and came into A.A., I thought life couldn't get any worse. Well, I guess worse is a relative term.

I'm forever grateful that the pain of hitting bottom was bad enough to bring me to a point of surrender. I was introduced to A.A. through a hospital rehab program. I soaked up all the wonderful things I was hearing in the A.A. meetings. I got a sponsor, read the Big Book, got to lots and lots of meetings, worked the steps and started to get better. I even found a relationship with a wonderful, loving Higher Power - not an easy task for this previously avowed atheist!

It's a good thing I got so plugged into A.A., because at 5 months sober I found myself in the position of getting divorced. Our marriage was just one big party and I wasn't so emotionally attached to him, it was just hard to go through the process. Well, in the middle of the process, my ex sued me for alimony. He quit his job (which is why I started the divorce proceedings), and I wasn't going to let him drag me down financially. He and I had worked for the same company and had made about the same salary. I thought the situation was absurdene owing him alimony???? Well, I left the courthouse with an order to pay him alimony.

I was dumbfounded. I went back to my sober living house. Thank God I did the things the folks in A.A. had told me, like getting phone lists from all my meetings, and calling the women on those lists to build my new Fellowship. I was on shaky ground that day, so I pulled out my phone lists and started calling some women. I left a few messages and then found someone home. She came and took me to a meeting - I didn't have to drink that day! The other women called me back and left messages. What a wonderful Fellowship! The A.A. folks carried me though a time I didn't know what to do. Before, drink had been my only tool to deal with the sadness, hurt, anger and resentment that I was feeling.

About 30 days later I faced another dilemma. I had to send him a check! Oh, I thought that was too much. Send him a check??? I wanted to hire Gino and Vito to break his legs - I didn't want to send him money. I didn't find any reference in the Big Book to breaking legs as an answer to any problem, so I talked to my A.A. friends about how to handle this. A wonderful friend helped me to realize that I had a RESENTMENT. And then, they referred me to page 552 of the Big Book. That page may have saved my sobriety and/or my life. It said on that page to pray for the person you resent. Pray for him???? I still had Vito and Gino on my mind - not prayer. It says to pray for them to receive all that you would want for yourself. I thought this A.A. answer was terrible. I did not want to pray for him. But I realized that I wanted to stay sober, and the answers I had been getting from A.A. folks had been helping me a lot.

There is a loophole in the middle of the paragraph on page 552. It says, "Even when you don't really want it for them and your prayers are only words and you don't mean it, go ahead and do it anyway." Well, I thought, I can do that. So I prayed for him. But, I added the words "but I don't mean it". I hurled the words toward my Higher Power with anger, but I said the words. One day at a time, my words became a little softer, and one day I stopped adding the "but I don't mean it". My heart softened, my resentment was being lifted from me. I don't know if my prayers helped him, but they helped me. I was able to send him that check - and stay sober. The alimony situation didn't last long at all, but it taught me an important lesson: I don't have to drink over anything! I can get through pain and not drink.





Of those 127 calls were for meeting info, 138 were office visitors and 11 resulted in a 12 step call. Our website stays busy too. It had 48,881 visits in the last 30 days. Dear Readers of the No Booze News,

It has been an honor and a privilege to be the editor for the East Valley Intergroup's newsletter. I have learned a lot about myself through this process, just as I do through any service work. I had an AA anniversary last week. For me this is a time to think about what I used to be like, what happened and what I am like now.

Seventeen years ago I stumbled into AA just sure that I couldn't drink anymore. I had no idea how that was going to happened because I couldn't imagine my life without alcohol, but I was sure I just couldn't drink as the wreckage of my life was too much to bear. I remember hearing, "You never HAVE to drink again." That pissed me off. They really meant, "You never GET to drink again." Victim, victim, victim. It has taken some time to see how I volunteered to be a victim for most of my life.

I went to the Gilbert Group Friday night Gratitude meeting. I had no gratitude. But I went again the next week and the week after that. I kept showing up and began slowly to say to myself that I better come up with something to be grateful for so I would have something to say in the meeting. Pillows. I was grateful for pillows because in Tent city I slept on a bare plastic mattress with no pillows. Some days that was all I could come up with. But gratitude slowly infiltrated my life and today I could no more do without it than I could air or water. I've spent many years now texting 5 things I'm grateful for to a friend or sponsee. This action has changed my attitude and my life.

An old-timer in that meeting would always say, "Gratitude is an action." I didn't get that for a long time. I thought it was a feeling. Its not. If I'm grateful for my meeting I show up and make coffee. If I'm grateful to get a sobriety coin, then I serve as the supply person in my group. If I'm grateful for my friends, I answer the phone. I answer the phone even when I don't want to, just like I show up to make coffee even when I want to stay home and watch Netflix.

Without knowing it I began to take responsibility for my own choices in life. I went through the steps with a sponsor, participated in my Home Group, kept a service position and reached out to others. I found a Higher Power. I started to see how life didn't really just "fall on my head". My actions mattered. Feelings didn't always matter. They usually come later. Most of the time I feel grateful, but I'm sure its because the action comes first.

Today I don't HAVE to drink. I GET to be sober. I get to have friends. I get to be grateful for a lot more than pillows today. And today, I am most grateful today for choices. I get to pick. If I want a home group I get to show up and participate. If want a friend I get to act like a friend. I can choose to behave poorly and not blame anyone but me when I get poor results. Or I can ask for help, walk through fear and pain, do the next right thing, help others and get the beautiful results that my God has in store for me.

I didn't know I had choices, that I get to pick, that life doesn't just "fall on my head." And it's the most beautiful life today. Thank you, sincerely, for allowing me to be of service. I am grateful for you.
