They're Playing My Song

In 1983, my wife left me because of my alcohol and drug addiction. I'd been trying to control it, but when she left, I moved into a small apartment and drank like there was no tomorrow. Two weeks later, I came out of a blackout one morning to realize that I'd fallen the night before and bruised my shoulder. I was afraid that next time I'd crack my head open and there would be no one there to find me. That afternoon I had lunch with a friend who told me her grandmother had died that way. I didn't drink for two days, but then someone offered me one and I took it.

That night I had dinner with another friend, and she told me that she was an alcoholic. She said that she believed that people were put in our lives for a reason, and that she was probably there to tell me about getting sober.

I had an old drinking buddy who'd stopped drinking two years earlier, and I decided to look him up. The next day, he walked into the university cafeteria. I hadn't seen him in six months and there he was. I was still afraid so I let him pass by, thinking I'd go to his office later. A few minutes later, he came back into the room. I got a lump in my throat and remembered my friend's words from the night before: "People are put in our lives for a reason." I figured that I was supposed to talk to Alex right then.

I swallowed my fear and pride and told him what I needed. He took me to a meeting and introduced me to the Fellowship of AA that night. It's been hard work but I haven't had a drink since then, and as a result my mind and heart are clear to hear many other "messages" that are sent my way.

Ten months after I stopped drinking, I went on an Easter picnic with sober friends. Many of them went for a hike, but I just poked around the campsite. In the desert sand, I found a little plastic box with a windup key-obviously the innards of a music box. Even though it had been sitting out in the desert for who knows how long, I wound it up.

It played "How Dry I Am."

It doesn't get any clearer than that for me--and God hasn't needed to give me such an obvious message since then.





Central Office Manager's Report June 17, 2022

In May we received 427 requests for information and assistance. Of those 111 calls were for meeting info, 114 were office visitors and 20 resulted in a 12-step call. Our website stayed busy too. It had 21,321 visits in the last 30 days. Our Google totals for May were 3,786 views. Of those 483 went to our website, 73 requested directions and 39 gave us a call.

GSO is currently offering mixed title discounts, giving us the opportunity to stock up on the slower moving titles at full discount pricing. We hope to take advantage of this when AAWS has resolved their supply issues. There are currently 12 books out of stock at AAWS. We are out of stock of HC and LP Big Books at the office but do have plenty soft cover BB. AAWS has sent an email with information and expected ship dates for all of their currently unavailable items. Big Books are due to ship next week. We have good stock levels of all the other titles at you Central Office.

Our liability insurance for the 2022/2023 period will be renewing at the end of the month. All updated and corrected certificates will be sent to the leaseholders of participating groups. There was quite a bit of relocation going on as some spaces reopened and some delayed but I think we have those requesting it covered at the correct locations.

We have been receiving great support from the Groups we serve. Lately we have gotten a few contributions with no Group names listed. This is just a friendly reminder to please note your group name with any contributions made on the website or by check to the office. Please let me know if your Group's contributions are not recorded correctly, I will research and correct them.

The ICOAA seminar has been moved to September 1 to 5 2022 in Denver CO. I am looking forward to attending live for the first time since we held it here in Mesa 2019.

Service opportunities are always available on all EVI committees and the 12th step list. Please take some Gratitude with Service forms back to your group and encourage members to volunteer. The life you save may be your own.

- 5. Some alcoholics will stay around AA only if we have a TV and card room. If this is what is required to carry the message to them, should we have these facilities?
- 6. How important in my recovery is the feeling of self-respect, rather than the feeling of being always under obligation for charity received?

A Good Sign: Making Amends Helen E. -March 2021

I sat in the back of the musty church basement in Oregon in 1981, rigid arms crossed on my chest. A sullen sneer marred my face. The other meeting attendees sat on the metal folding chairs and seemed cheerful, happy to see one another. Their happiness revolted and separated me from all of them. Besides, I knew I was far too young to be an alcoholic.

I did not want to stop drinking. In fact, I refused to stop drinking. So how did this frightened, defiant woman come to be sitting in a meeting of AA? It would take a lifetime to find the answer.

Despite the disgusting cheerfulness, I returned to the same uncomfortable seat the following night. And again, the night after that. I returned for one reason only. There was something important to me in the words of a ghastly sign on the meeting's pale-yellow wall, obscured by decades of cigarette smoke. It read:

For ALL that has been, Thanks. For ALL that will be, Yes.

I missed much of what was said during those meetings because that sign and I were engaged in a tussle in my mind. For all? That means everything! Thank you for everything bad that has happened to me? I couldn't believe what I was reading. I was supposed to be thankful for the childhood trauma and thankful for not having enough of anything, not money, friendship, peace of mind? Thanks a lot for nothing, I achingly edited in my head.

Yet the following night I returned and sat right across from that sign. Yes for all that will be? Yeah, right. For the continuing pain, for the hangovers I knew would never end, for the messed up life I continued to live? Yes? I was outraged by that sign.

As you might guess, it would be many years before I could acknowledge that I participated in most of what went wrong in my life. It would take a long time for me to humble myself enough to ask my sponsor, a woman named Ruth, to take me through the Twelve Steps. I would engage in what would be a painful and humbling experience of self-examination before I could rise toward a healing experience that allowed me to see the role I played in most of my pain. I would need to face the people I had harmed. I would need to then do what I could to make the situation right and start living a life I was not ashamed to live.

It took a long time, and I am not done. God, whatever that means, is not done with me yet.

That stained and faded sign (not an official AA sign, I found out later) currently still hangs on that wall in Coos Bay, Oregon, where God blessed me with sobriety. Today I live far away from that old church basement. But deep in my heart, a sign with profound meaning can be found:

For ALL that has been,
Thanks.
For ALL that will be,

Yes
