NO BOOZE NEWS

Right Where I Left Off -Susan M.

After five years in the program of AA, I thought I understood the true nature of the disease. I also thought I was spiritually fit. I still attended weekly AA meetings, although sporadically, I'd become comfortable.

<u>Simplicity</u>

And one more thing; none of us would be here today if somebody hadn't taken time to explain things to us, to give us a little pat on the back, to take us to a meeting or two, to have done numerous little kind and thoughtful acts in our behalf. –Dr. Bob S.

One day someone said something

that hurt my feelings. I let all the pain I had ever experienced in my life hurt me once again. I cried and cried about it. But I didn't call my sponsor. Later that day, I gave a neighbor a ride home from the store near my house. We were to have lunch, but I had five shots of vodka instead. I attempted to move my car and ended up in a cell downtown. It was just that quick.

My disease is truly cunning, baffling and powerful and had reared its ugly nature once again, only this time, my consequences were steep. All the times I had driven drunk and now I had gotten a DUI in my own driveway! It is true that you pick up right where you left off. At least, it was true for me.

For the past six months, I have been leading a sober life again, sharing daily with a wonderful sponsor and praying and meditating. These things have helped me "grow through the pain." God has once again helped me through. My anger, fear and resentment have healed. I am truly at peace with myself. As long as I allow God to do his will in my life I can stay sober. Today, I value my sobriety. I make better choices, set firmer boundaries and read and write daily literature. Each day I take one day at a time leads me on my journey in recovery.

Time To Check Out | Money And Sobriety

I've done it all. I don't drink. I go to meetings. I call my sponsor. I did the Steps. I gladly do service. And of course, I reach out to help other alcoholics.

But after all of this, there's more? Apply the principles of AA "in all my affairs"? Every day? Forget it. That's simply too much to ask this recovering alcoholic, no matter how many years I have in the program.

Most of the time I do quite well. Remember, "it's progress, not perfection."

At a restaurant, wedding, fancy party or ball game, I'm an AA superstar. But doing the family food shopping? Now that's another story. If you see me "in action" at a grocery store, please, I beg you, don't tell my sponsor how I acted when...

- 1) The shopper in front of me in the "15 items or less" line starts to place 27 items on the conveyer belt.
- 2) The guy in front of me leaves the checkout counter to get the one item he "forgot."
- 3) Someone has an endless conversation with the cashier about her granddaughter's amazing report card.
- 4) "Starving" shoppers reach and grab food from the salad bar, using their hands.
- 5) A driver cuts me off to get the last remaining parking spot.
- 6) I get to the store and it doesn't open its front door one minute early, leaving customers to freeze outside. And...
- 7) An SUV has been parked so close to my car that I can't even open my door to get in.

I'm 76 years old with 28 years in the program. It may be too late for this grouchy old-timer to change no matter how many times I do the Steps.

But thankfully, I can always do another Step 10. I'm an expert at apologies. Though I'd rather be an expert at "doing the next right thing." -Definitely Steve, Nashville

Central Office Manager's Report December 16, 2022

We received 359 requests for information and assistance in November. Of those 90 calls were for meeting info, 90 were office visitors and 11 resulted in a good old fashioned 12 step call. Our website stayed busy with 29,419 visits. And our Google totals for last month were 3,282 views. Of those 369 went to our website, 73 requested directions and 43 gave us a call.

<u>Liquid Misery</u> | *A Step One Journey*

As I sat in a meeting recently, I learned of another friend's death during a relapse. I thought of the other AA members I knew who had died after relapsing. My memories of them were still fresh in my mind. I had talked and shared with them. Some of them I had known for years.

One member used to walk to meetings and pick up trash. He was down-to-earth and wanted to help keep his town clean. Another had been in and out of the program for 19 years. Like me, a lot of friends around the tables still missed him.

Yet another was a newcomer, a college girl with her whole life ahead of her. Her parents were left to pick up the pieces.

These people who relapsed were just like me. We can't drink like other people, even though we think we can. I thanked my Higher Power that I hadn't died when I relapsed and wondered whether there was anything I could have said or done to prevent my friends' relapses.

I talked about relapse in meetings. I prayed and meditated on it. I thought back on my own relapse. I had struggled for about four months to stay sober. I felt that I wasn't getting any better. I was full of guilt, shame and self-pity. I just wanted to feel better, so I took a drink. I lifted a bottle to my mouth and down it went. It was liquid misery. The misery went down my throat, into my stomach and veins, and throughout my body. I didn't feel better. I remember standing in the street, every cell in my body screaming for a drink, and the words, "half measures availed us nothing," came to my mind from "How It Works" in the Big Book. Somehow I asked for help. My Higher Power answered, and I ended up at a meeting.

Before that relapse, AA had been working for me, maybe not like I wanted it to, but I had felt better. So this time I went back to AA with a new attitude. This time I had a spark of hope. I remember reading "How It Works" now with new meaning. The words stayed with me.

I worked the Steps again; I knew I had to be fearless and thorough, from Step One all the way through. When life's problems came up, which they did, the words, we "tried to hold on to our old ideas and the result was nil until we let go absolutely," would pop into my mind. I had to learn a new way of dealing with my resentments and problems. I knew I had to grasp and develop "a manner of living which demands rigorous honesty." This meant I had to be honest with others and myself. No more lying or telling half-truths. I began to see that AA could work for a drunk like me. –Jeff H.
