### **Choosing Happiness**

I was recently asked to tell my story at a speaker meeting, in my 7th year of sobriety. I agreed to do it, and in closing read the following, which I wrote after I got my first sponsee.

As we work this program, it kind of works us, in stages. The first stage is learning to not

drink or use, learning how to accept and maneuver life on life's terms, feeling our feelings instead of numbing them. Only then, can we move into the second stage, where we use the skills we have learned and the advice of our sponsors to create and enjoy a purposeful and happy life. It may sound contradictory, but working this program for me has simultaneously both required, and created, faith.

I had been miserable and hopeless for so long that not having those feelings as constant companions took some getting used to. AA taught me that misery was not an unchangeable fact of my life. Instead, two things had created my misery: my choices and my focus up to that point in my life. My focus had been on self-destruction—though I would not have called it that then—and there was an alternative open to me in this program that was not open to me before. The questions I asked myself began to change:

Beginning to get sober takes courage, willingness and open-mindedness to believe good things are both possible and available to us. In this program I have watched others make that transition and have made it myself, a shift for which I am profoundly grateful and that I credit to the fact that I pray for guidance daily, take time to listen and watch for its arrival and ask to be given the willingness to follow it. Every day I choose to take the constructive, self-respecting actions I have learned in this program, every day I choose to focus on what is good in my life—good that is invariably there if I will just look for it—I build for myself a little more faith in God, a little more faith in this program, and a little more faith in humanity, none of which I had before.

### **A New Employer**

When I came into AA, I had a fulltime job as a lockbox clerk. This meant I spent eight hours a day photocopying and stapling. It was mindless work, but I didn't have much of a mind when I was new, so it was a good fit.

Computers do all this now, but I'm so grateful that I was allowed to work that job at that point.

As the years of recovery progressed so did my career, by fits and starts—and occasional giant leaps—much like my recovery. By the grace of God, who can use my character defects of control and manipulation to his advantage, I eventually found myself in something my friend John describes as a "big-deal" job, making more money than this alcoholic ever dreamed would be possible.

Our literature says we drank in good times as well as bad; of course, with the money came additional responsibilities and stresses. Part of my job meant that I was dealing with senior-level management, and at times I was completely caught up in personalities before principles. To be clear, it was my personality, not theirs, which was the issue.

The Third Step in the Big Book was, and it still is, a source of comfort, solace and guidance. In "How It Works," it reminds me that: "the alcoholic is an extreme example of self-will run riot, though he usually doesn't think so." Over the years I've figured out that whenever I don't think I'm being that example of self-will run riot, I probably am. So it raises the hazy suspicion that I could be off the tracks again. It further reminds me that: "First of all, we had to quit playing God," and that: "hereafter in this drama of life, God was going to be our Director."

The line that really gets me, though, is on the next page: "We had a new Employer." That's right—I don't work for the folks on the ninth floor; God is my real employer! So whenever I'm having alcoholic thoughts and feelings about those folks, I find myself back at this passage. It's not myself, or my bank account, or my future retirement that I'm working for. I'm working for my Higher Power. I only have to do the next right thing, treat others as I would like to be treated, listen for and do his will to the best of my ability, and let go.

It's so simple, so easy and so sane. This passage never fails to restore me to sanity, and I always leave it feeling so grateful that I don't have to run the show.

## Central Office Manager's Report March 17, 2022

February was a busy short month. We assisted 825 people at the office with 20 of those resulting in 12 step calls. Our website stayed busy too. It had 30,749 visits in the last 30 days. Our Google listing also receives steady traffic. Our Google totals for February were 2,568 views, of those 312 visited our website and 81 asked for directions. Our website stayed busy too. It had 26,622 visits in the last 30 days.

We have renewed our bulk mailing permit for 2023. This is the permit used for mailing newsletters. It goes up a bit every year. This year it was \$290. Our Costco membership has also been renewed.

A large literature order has been placed before the price increase at AAWS goes into effect on April 3. This should allow us to hold the old pricing until June or July when we will need to restock at the higher price and pass that on.

The weather is warming up and along with it comes the Campout and Roundup season. We have information available on most of the upcoming A.A. events in AZ and surrounding states at the office and in the No Booze News. Please share your IGR newsletter copy with your group and encourage them to subscribe for home delivery.

There is a potential new, in-house pamphlet on "Tips On Attending Meetings" or "Meeting Etiquette". Please take a few copies back to your group for their input. Does your group think this may be an appropriate tool to help newcomers acclimate to the meeting environment? We will ask for feedback next month.
