While browsing in a small-town bookstore, I discovered a priceless

treasure: someone's well-worn Big Book. It had a \$6 price tag.

Whenever I see an old Big Book, I can't help but wonder how it ended up on a lonely shelf away from our homes and meeting rooms. I like to rescue them and put them back out into circulation. Having a few extra books on hand is a great way to carry the message when a person expresses interest in learning more about AA.

This well-worn book looked like any other until I opened it and the magic spilled out. Underneath the traditional blue dust jacket was a beautifully embroidered book cover (pictured at left). It was unbelievably sweet. Multicolored flowers were hand-embroidered above the nickname of the former owner. At the top of the first page was written: "Purchased 9-30-83." It also had her full name. Bless her heart, she was 61 when she got sober. I would arrive in AA the following year at the age of 21.

In Chapter 2, we're reminded: "We are people who normally would not mix. But there exists among us a fellowship, a friendliness, and an understanding which is indescribably wonderful." This has certainly been my experience.

On the front and back pages of the book are names and phone numbers with inscriptions with promises to keep in touch as they begin their new lives.

"I feel so much happiness for having known you."

"If you ever need any help around the house, moving or just need someone to talk to I'll be there."

"Thank you for being my friend."

"I've never had the pleasure of meeting a woman of your caliber."

"Give me a call anytime you want to talk."

"You have given me something special ...hope that I can work my troubles out."

"Please feel free to call me if you're feeling down."

"God go with you."

When I opened the book, I felt such a flood of emotions and thought, "Oh sister, it's time for you to come home..."

Because the owner had written her full name in the front of the book, I was easily able to find her obituary. She passed in 2014 at the age of 91. She had a doctoral degree from a prestigious university and had enjoyed an interesting career. In AA we seem to be separated by far fewer than "six degrees," so I was hardly surprised to learn that my former sponsee knew her.

I learned the owner of this well-loved Big Book had enjoyed long-term sobriety and carried the message to many. I heard she was a wise, kind and independent lady who stayed sober and sponsored many strong women.

Because I was looking for a Big Book to pass along, I was given this priceless gift from a woman with long-term sobriety. One day I will pass the book along to a younger woman. In the meantime, she will continue to carry the message to me.

Central Office Manager's Report

May 19, 2023

In April we received 431 requests for information and assistance. Of those 110 calls were for meeting info, 128 were office visitors and 9 resulted in a 12-step call. Our website stayed busy too. It had 24,993 visits in the last 30 days. Our Google totals for March were 2,926 views. Of those 276 went to our website, 54 requested directions and 76 gave us a call.

Our 2022 taxes have been filed. We reported \$143,195.47 in income.

We purchased a large literature order in March and were able to keep book sales at the lower price for 2 extra months.

Hopefully the groups have been able to take advantage of this extra time to stock up a bit. We will update our pricing on June 1st.

If your group is planning an outing or special event, please let us know. We can put it in the newsletter and help spread the word. We also have several large coffee pots that groups can borrow, just call and reserve.

We have been receiving great support from the Groups we serve. Lately we have gotten a few contributions with no Group names listed. This is just a friendly reminder to please note your group name with any contributions made on the website or by check to the office. Please let me know if your Group's contributions are not recorded correctly, I will research and correct them.

We need office volunteers. Morning and afternoon shifts are available. Please discuss with your group all the service opportunities that are available thru your East Valley Intergroup. Please take some Gratitude with Service forms back to your group and encourage them to volunteer. The life you save may be your own.

Chairperson's Report: JJ. – nothing new to report. Vice Chairperson Report: Austin – sent a report to J – Austin will be at Founders Day and at the Post-Conference Assembly.

Office Manager Report: Kim W. – Written report in packet. 2022 taxes have been filed. Our large literature order in March has enabled us to keep book sales at the lower prices for an extra 2 months. Prices will go up on June 1st. Folding day is May 25th 9am – come to the office to help out – coffee, donuts, fellowship, folding. There is a new meeting in Superior – sparsely populated area- if you are near there on a Tuesday at 7pm please support them – 52 N Canal Ave. Received some checks from groups without the group name on them- but they have the GSO group number on them. The group conscience of AA in the U.S. and Canada seems to have agreed upon six points that define an AA group:

- 1) All members of a group are alcoholics, and all alcoholics are eligible for membership.
- 2) As a group, they are fully self-supporting.
- 3) A group's primary purpose is to help alcoholics recover through the Twelve Steps.
- 4) As a group, they have no outside affiliation.
- 5) As a group, they have no opinion on outside issues.
- 6) As a group, their public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion, and they maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, TV, and film.

Last June I was asked by a deaf friend to speak at the weekly deaf AA meeting here (I am a hearing person but sign somewhat fluently). The meeting was to be held at its usual place and time, in a church a few towns away from me. I arrived a little early and enjoyed chatting with people outside while we were waiting for the church doors to be unlocked. We waited and waited, but no one from the church showed up. Being creative alcoholics, we all agreed to have our meeting in the playground in the back of the church. We sat around on the slides and the swings.

My friend announced at the beginning of the meeting that he was sorry the meeting would have to be shorter than usual, because when it got dark, there would be no way to communicate! We got on with things and I told my story. It was discussion time. Here is the best part: just as my friend stood up to again apologize for having to stop early, the playground was flooded with light! Three large spotlights had been turned on by an unseen hand, and we were able to continue the meeting. Later I realized that of course the lights were coordinated to come on with the darkness. But never mind--we "saw the light"!

Our Sixth Step, Tradition and Concept

Tradition 6) An A.A. group ought never endorse, finance or lend the A.A. name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property and prestige divert us from our primary purpose.
