# The Freedom to Change--Or Not

Into Action | Larry H.

I used to wonder how long it would take to be rid of my character defects. I remember complaining to my sponsor about the pain and suffering they still caused after being sober several years and about the fact that some of them seemed to be as bad as ever. What would it take to be rid of these negative emotional ties to the past? Would I have to drink again and get a good case of the jitters, as described in the Big Book, or was I going to straighten out some day?

This weighed heavily on me, so I asked my sponsor what to do. He said, "I have good news and bad news." (Whenever he uses that phrase, I want to become invisible.) I asked him for the bad news first. He said, "The bad news is, the day we put you in the ground, providing you stay sober that long, you will be the same person you were the day you came here. The good news is you will enjoy that a lot less." He went on to explain that, like most people, alcoholics have the usual set of character defects, but we hone them to a razor's edge and use them to cut our lives to ribbons. Just because we get sober does not mean that these traits will disappear. On the contrary, they become more noticeable than ever, because when we shed light on our defects, they become easier to see and more difficult to practice.

It turns out that the reason I still revert to my old ways is because I still value them, much as I hate to admit it. As Step Six says, some of my character defects may be lifted as the desire to drink was; but as for the rest, I will have to be content with patient improvement.

When I took inventory and looked at the nature of my wrongs, I also learned that everything brings forth its own kind. For example, anger brings forth more anger; it never brings forth happiness. The same is true with love. It never brings forth hate; it can only bring forth affection. Seeing this was a real wake-up call, because when I now look around at what I have created, be it good or bad, I'm forced to take responsibility for it.

When my life is full of happiness and joy, it means that happiness and joy are important to me, and anger and depression are valueless. Originally, I could not accept this simple truth because it was too easy, and I'd been taught that anything worthwhile is hard. I mean if it were that simple, then everyone could have it. But I eventually learned that this was the basic truth I had been seeking, and it has given me the ability to change my life.

The next question was, How could I bring about this change when all I've known is chaos? Experience has shown that when I combine one thought with another thought, I get a headache; but when I combine a thought with action, it always produces a result. The paradox that says I have to give it away to keep it is true enough; however, it is also true that I must give it away to get it. When I give love, then I am able to experience love, and the more I give, the more I have. The old tape that says I must receive love to have love is false. The truth is, I must give love so that I may truly experience it. God makes that possible.

I find it amazing how capable I am of overlooking the obvious. I mean, this is what the literature has been telling me all along. I guess my receiver was off the hook, or maybe I just had to hear the message on a different frequency. Whatever the case may be, I have gained much freedom from this simple truth. What's more, just as I have the freedom to use the God of my understanding or not, I have that same freedom to practice my character defects or not. God also makes that possible.

So it would seem that I am a product of my actions more than my thoughts, and through action I possess the ability to cause change in my life.  $\sim$

# Central Office Manager's Report September 15, 2023

In August it was hot. We received 412 requests for information and assistance during office hours. Of those 108 calls were for meeting info, 113 were office visitors and 10 resulted in a 12-step call. Our website stayed busy with 22,515 visits. And our Google totals for last month were 2,404 views. Of those 324 went to our website, 86 requested directions and 55 gave us a call.

The Meeting Guide app currently connects 527 A.A. entities and lists over 150,000 meetings. Data providers, like EVI, can now get a dashboard account to meeting guide to monitor the information being reported.

We have started working with a local company that provides technology services. To date they have corrected the website Events page. It now scales correctly to mobile devices and is more readable in all formats.

We now have a Square remote credit card processing account that we can use to take payments remotely. It was well received at the bowling event and will be available at future events.

Please discuss with your group all the service opportunities that are available thru your East Valley Intergroup. Answer the A.A. hotline, go on an old fashioned 12 step call, take a meeting to a home bound member, share information about A.A. with the public and professional community, help put on an event, print and fold directories and newsletters or take a shift at the office. These are just a few of the services we provide and it takes hundreds of volunteers.

Then it was Micah's turn to climb. He put on the harness, tightened his helmet, and raced up the rock face. He had no fear and was confident to a fault. It took him only four minutes to scale the face and reach the "Stop here" flag. He didn't stop. He kept climbing higher. Yelling at him did no good. Telling him he could get hurt did no good. Telling him he would be sent home and relinquish all future field trips didn't stop him. Then he looked down.

Panic is panic. We all deal with it differently. Twelve-year-old Micah dealt with his panic by freezing in place. He was literally scared still. Below him, his friends were telling him where to put his feet and hands. But he wouldn't listen. He denied being stuck. He assured everyone that he could get down on his own. Others offered to show him how to get down but he refused. I told him to just lean back and let us lower him down on his bolle (safety) line. That was the last thing he wanted to do. But he stayed stuck.

I harnessed up and climbed to Micah to assure him that getting down was no problem. He was stuck, scared, and still trying to be brave. I showed him foot and handholds but he refused. I explained how by letting go of the rock he could be lowered to the ground on his rope and not have to worry about climbing down. This was totally unacceptable. "I'm not letting go of this rock." He was adamant. "You're going to have to let go," I told him. "I'm going to fall!" he bawled. "God's not going to let you fall," I said. Micah said, "God's not here."

"Micah," I said, "Today I'm God." And with that statement I grabbed onto his shirt and yanked him off the rock face. For a moment he was terrified. When he realized that he wasn't going to die and that the ground was coming closer, he calmed down.

Micah was lowered to the ground and his classmates helped unharness him. To his surprise, and some of mine, no one teased him or made fun of him. They just went on with the day and harnessed up someone else. A few stories then arose of others who had been stuck and needed help getting down.

I reflected on the series of events. I had just yanked a student off the face of a cliff. Micah didn't listen to the rules. He made his own. He didn't see any danger in what he was doing. He didn't believe anything would happen to him. He had everything under control. He got stuck. He wouldn't admit it. He wouldn't listen to anyone's advice. He wouldn't let anyone help him. He had someone force him to do something he really didn't want to do. He had to give in to a Higher Power. He survived the ordeal. He found that others have survived similar ordeals.

I know someone else like that. Someone who is thankful every day for a chance at life. A sober life.

I was taking off my harness when a volunteer parent came up to me. With a big grin she said: "Which do you think the school board is going to believe: that you are God, or that you rescued a student from the cliff?"
