# NO BOOZE NEWS

#### Where There Is Despair, Let There Be Hope

As I allowed alcohol to consume my life, I became a cyclone twister that destroyed everything in my path—faith, marriage, family, self-respect. The more alcohol I put in me the more negative and selfish I became, and the bigger the intensity of the twister. Until on February of 2011, when I came to a complete and sudden halt of destruction.

I woke up in the ICU unit at the hospital on February 6th, being reminded to breathe while a team of doctors and nurses removed a long, clear plastic tube from my throat. The grey dark clouds of the twister lay heavy upon my heart and soul except for one small opening through which shone a small bright beam of hope. This image of hope quickly vanished from my mind when my parents and brother came into the hospital room to inform me I had been in a terrible car accident. My mind quickly raced to my two daughters in the back seat of the SUV.

I opened my mouth to ask the question I didn't want to hear the answer to, but my father, who was kneeling next to my bedside, spoke up in a gentle way to tell me my 4-year-old was hurt too badly and didn't make it.

A storm of tears came flooding out of me. Through my sobbing, I managed to ask how my 5-year-old was holding up. I was told she was doing fine and liked eating popsicles. I lay in my hospital bed full of remorse, shame, and guilt, questioning God: "Why wouldn't he have taken me instead?" When I was discharged from the hospital, I was on the verge of a divorce. I stayed at a relative's house to prepare for the unthinkable: my daughter's funeral.

...The hardest point in the day was waking up to the nightmare I had created. I took a deep breath, said a prayer, and put one foot in front of the other. Along the way I stumbled, feeling like I had little purpose in life and absolutely no hope. But God was opening doors and doing things for me I couldn't do for myself. He opened the doors to AA, where an overwhelming feeling of support and unconditional love was present. I kept quiet, not even saying my name. I thought: If I say who I am they will know what I did and not accept me. Because I certainly didn't accept myself.

I found out it was okay not to speak or share, but members made sure I knew I was welcome inside the rooms of AA. Over the next several weeks, I started to become comfortable with the smiling faces and hugs I received, so I started to actively listen to what was going on around me. It was suggested to get a sponsor, so I did. It was suggested I get a Big Book, so I did. I was suggested I get another woman's phone number, and I did. These were steps I took to stay sober, putting one foot in front of the other. Taking these small actions, I began to feel like I had a purpose in life, which was to stay sober one day at a time so I could be a better wife and mother. I began feeling more hopeful; somehow, through this ugly nightmare, I found the blessings and rewards of love, hope, faith and family. The more actions I took through AA—working the Steps with my sponsor, staying in the day (sometimes moment), using a gratitude list to stay out of myself—the more my heart and mind began to open to the blessings around me. God continued to open doors for me by reuniting me with my husband who loves me unconditionally. My despairing thoughts have lessened (although I am still sad, yes) and my thoughts of hope increase as I stay sober, one day at a time





### Central Office Manager's Report November 17, 2023

In October activity started to pick up a bit with the return of our winter members. We received 378 requests for information and assistance during office hours. Of those 109 calls were for meeting info, 93 were office visitors and 8 resulted in a 12-step call. Our website stayed busy with 19,818 visits. And our Google totals for last month were 2,122 views. Of those 318 went to our website, 44 requested directions and 34 gave us a call.

GSO is conducting a membership survey on their website. Have you ever wondered who those members are that get surveyed? It could be you. Just go to aa.org and look for: "Take the A.A. Membership Survey now! Closes November 26, 2023. Click Here" We placed and have received a large literature order. AAWS is offering an additional 15% discount on orders in November and December.
